

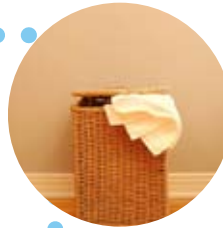


There's always room to recycle!

Recycling isn't just for the kitchen or garage. It's for every room in the house. There might be several materials in each room of your home that you never thought about recycling before. Are you recycling all that you can around your home?



KITCHEN Your kitchen is cooking with recyclable items. Aluminum foil and cans, steel cans such as soup and tomato paste cans, plastic milk jugs and orange juice bottles, glass bottles and jars can all be recycled. Don't forget about paper items that can be recycled from your kitchen such as cereal boxes, brown paper bags, paper egg cartons and paper towel rolls.



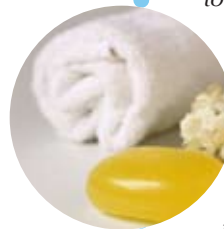
LAUNDRY ROOM Clean up your act in your laundry room by recycling liquid detergent bottles, bleach bottles, powder soap boxes and fabric softener boxes.



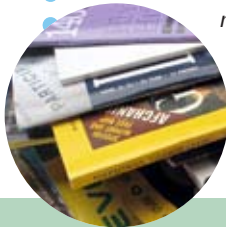
BEDROOM No sleeping on the job! Look around your bedroom for recyclable items such as newspapers, magazines and catalogs, gift boxes and shoe boxes.



HOME OFFICE Make recycling part of your workday. There's plenty to recycle in your home office, including writing paper, copy paper, envelopes, junk mail and outdated phone books.



BATHROOM In your bathroom, items such as toilet paper rolls are considered paperboard paper and are recyclable in the Yuba-Sutter Curbside Recycling program. Tissue boxes, soap boxes, medicine boxes and other paperboard and cardboard boxes are all recyclable. Empty shampoo, conditioner, mouthwash, contact lens solution and liquid soap bottles along with other plastic bottles with a "neck" or "screw-top" are also recyclable. Even empty aerosol cans such as shaving cream and air-freshener can be recycled in your blue recycling cart.



FAMILY ROOM In your family room, items such as old TV guides, magazines, newspapers and beverage containers are all recyclable.

Setting up a Household Recycling System

- Place a separate bin or paper bag in rooms where lots of recyclable items are used. For example, the kitchen, home office and laundry room. When these bins get full, empty them into your recycling cart.
- Before emptying a personal waste basket from a bedroom or office, check to see if there are any recyclable items you can pull out and recycle instead.
- Pick a spot close to your recycling bin to go through your mail so that recycling your junk mail, envelopes and catalogs will be that much easier.
- Before sitting down to do a craft project or organize your files, grab a recycling bin or an empty box to collect paper scraps, old bills, folders and envelopes.
- When cleaning out your garage, refrigerator, basement, cabinets and closets, make sure a recycling bin, box or paper bag is nearby for collecting recyclable items.

Please place your recycling, green waste and trash carts on either side of your driveway at the edge of the curb. Wheels should be next to the curb with the front of the cart facing out toward the street. **Allow a minimum of three feet of clearance between carts and four feet of clearance between your cart and other objects such as cars, basketball hoops and mailboxes.** Please position your recycling, green waste and trash carts in a manner so pedestrians can use the sidewalk.
